1.0 Introduction

There are several reports available to districts and schools to assist in determining a student's progress toward graduation.

Each student in BC must be assigned a Program of Study by grade 10.

2.0 Program of Study

2.1 What is a Program of Study?

To earn a diploma for graduation in BC, a student must earn a specific number of course credits, that in turn meet specific requirements, established by the Ministry.

- Students must be assigned a Program of Study on or before grade 10.
- Students are generally assigned only one Program of Study but if they have more than one assigned, there must be one that is marked as "Is Primary?".
- Specific courses are set up in MyEducation BC to meet each requirement in a program of study (determined by the Ministry)
 - Courses are determined to meet a requirement when there is a final mark and credits are earned.
- When all requirements for a Program of Study are met (course credits earned for each requirement), a student is eligible to receive the appropriate diploma or certificate.
 - A Dogwood diploma for graduation
 - A French Immersion/Francophone Dual Dogwood diploma for graduation
 - An Adult Dogwood for the BC Adult Graduation Diploma Program
 - o An Evergreen certificate for a School Completion Certificate Program





2.1.1 Programs of Study

Programs of Study assigned to a student captures and tracks progress toward completion of the program through course credits that meet the requirements of the program.

When the student completes all requirements for the assigned Program of Study, they will be awarded:

- A diploma for graduation, or
- Certificate of completion.

Every BC student in grade 10-12 must be assigned a Program of Study

- Hint: if you receive an error running a Grad report, check to ensure there is a Primary Program of Study assigned.
- If a student is assigned more than one Program of Study, one must be the PRIMARY.

Programs of Study do not automatically populate in MyEducation BC, they are required for TRAX and the Graduation Reports. This field can be populated as part of the registration process.







2.1.1.3 Assigning a New Program of Study to Multiple Students










2.1.1.7 Mass Updating a Program of Study for Multiple Students

3.0 Graduation Requirements, Course Requirements

Courses are added to a student schedule. Courses are set up to meet requirements a student must meet to graduate with a diploma or certificate. Each Program of Study has its own set of graduation requirements a student must meet to receive the diploma or certificate from the Ministry when they leave grade 12.

Students must meet different requirements to receive a diploma in English vs French.

Fujitsu is in discussions with Follett to determine if BC Custom versions of these reports are a potential future enhancement.



The purpose of the DVR is to provide districts and schools the ability to assess the student's accomplishments towards meeting their graduation requirements of their primary program of study.

- a summary of a student's progress towards graduation or toward meeting the requirements outlined in the assigned primary Program of Study.
- can be run at both the School and District levels to ensure that students have the proper credits required to meet the primary Program of Study assigned to them for graduation.

Note: When running the report, ensure you have only the student(s) selected that you want to run the report for.

Courses with failing Interim or Final Marks will display on the Diploma Verification Report. The report is intended for student, school or counsellor purposes.



Requirements for graduation:

- A box is completed and marked with an "X" if:
 - All course(s) or assessment(s) have been completed to meet the requirement
 - a final mark and credits have been assigned to the course(s) meeting the requirement
 - a Provincial assessment has a final mark
- A box is marked with an "\" if:
 - A course that meets the requirement is in progress or is on the student's schedule.
 - A course that meets the requirement is in progress with a passing mark or NO mark. (potential credits will be displayed in Section 2).
 - If the course is scheduled or In Progress with a failing interim or final mark, the requirement will NOT be met on the DVR.

The DVR also displays Numeracy Assessment (NMA) and Literacy Assessment (LTA) requirements:

Special Case:

- A or E a student doesn't have to complete the assessment so the requirement will be checked as having been met on the DVR
- Q Disqualified requirement not met
- X Incomplete requirement not met

The special case is considered first and then a proficiency mark of "blank, 0, 1, 2, 3, 4"
